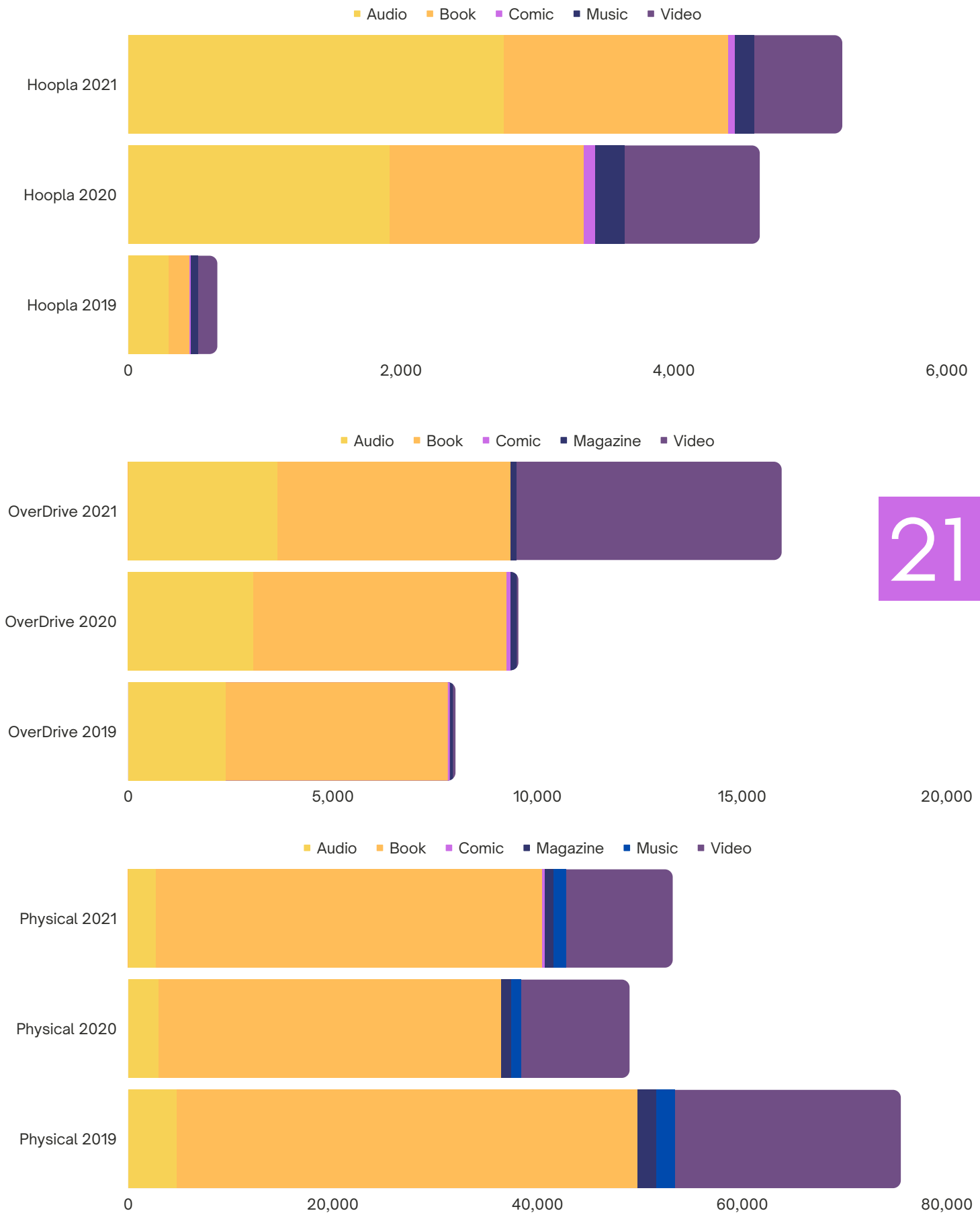

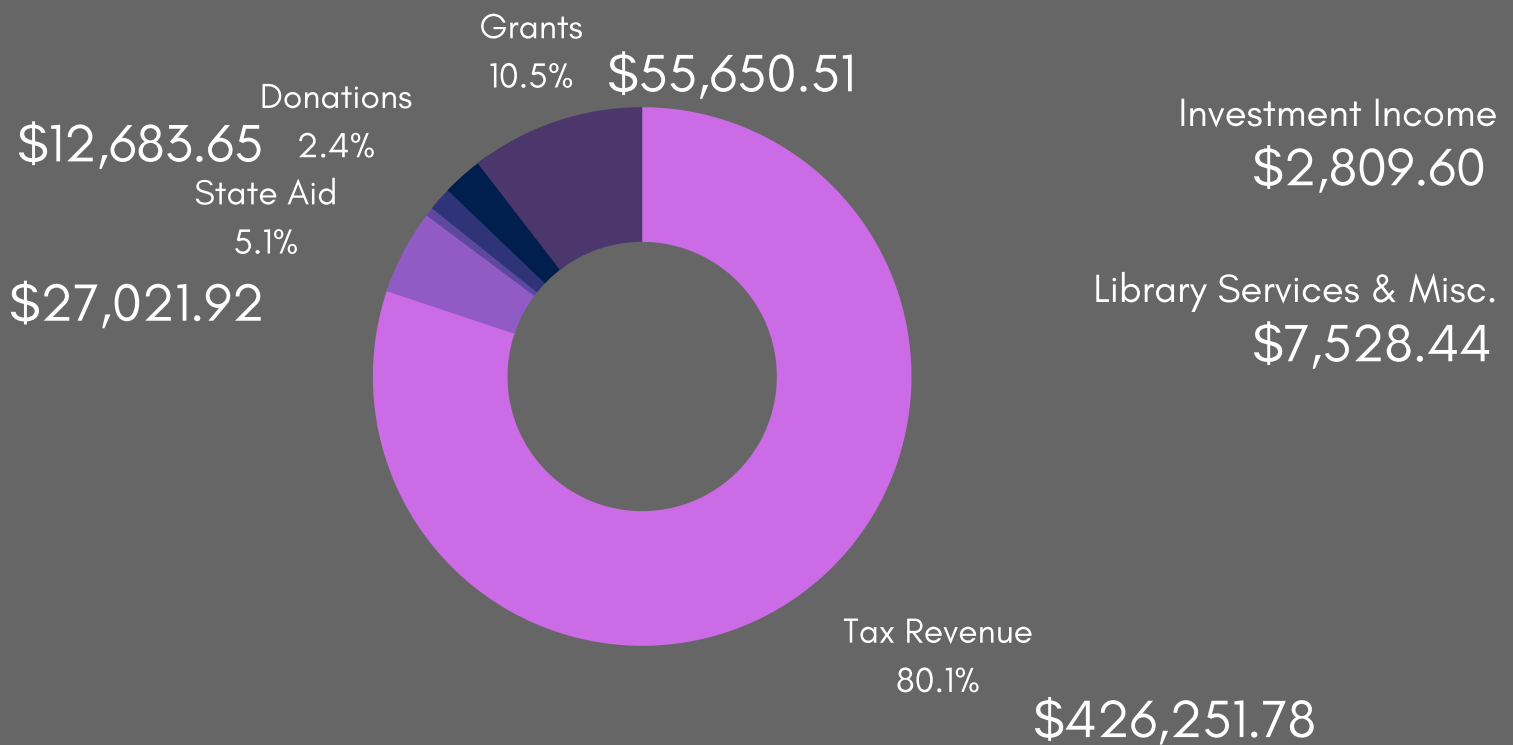

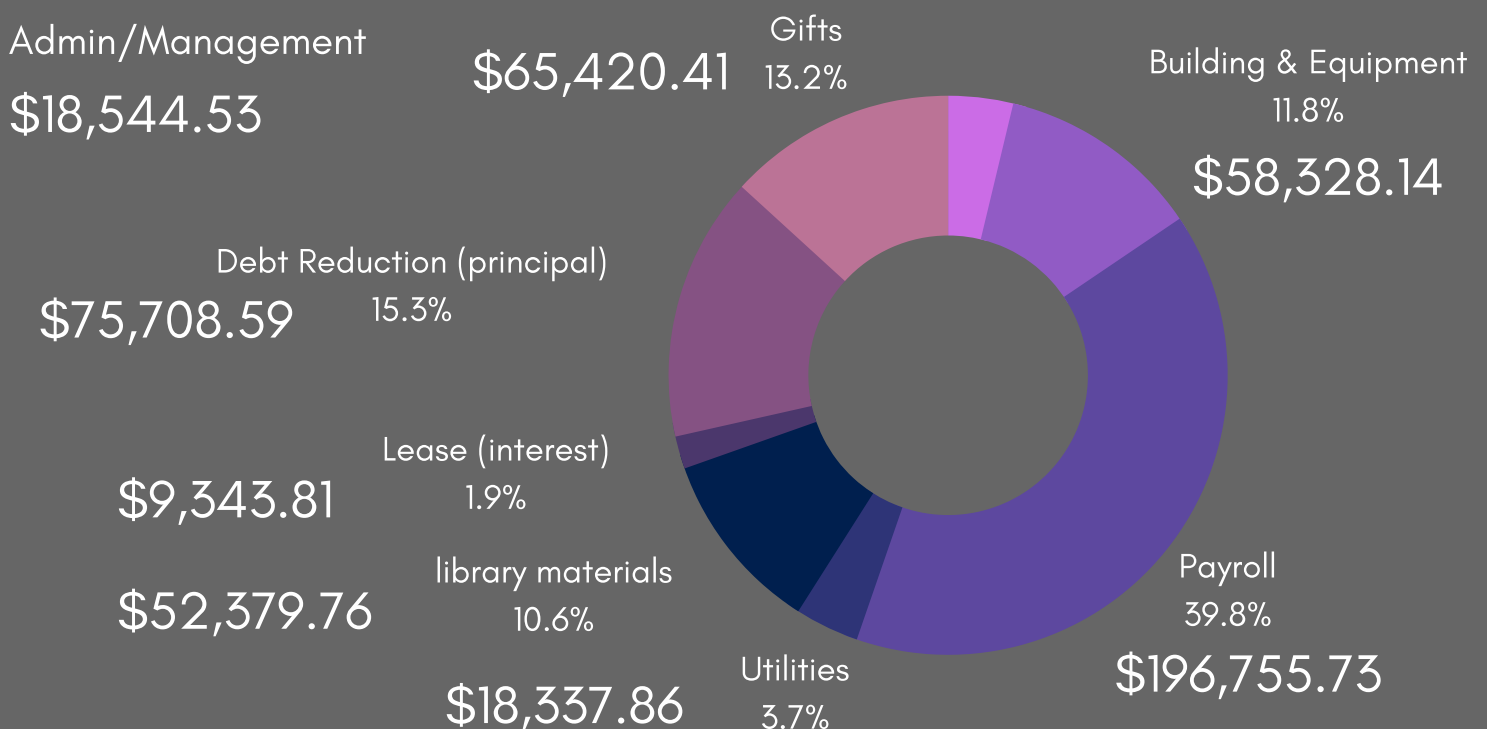

Morgan County CARES Act Grant



The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security ACT (CARES Act) passed on March 27, 2020 and signed by President Trump established the Coronavirus Relief Fund and appropriated \$150 billion to the Coronavirus Relief Fund. This fund was to be used to make payments for specified uses to states and certain local governments. Morgan County received \$2,419,959.00 to support the needs within Morgan County.

Morgan County used the guidelines provided by the U.S. Department of Treasury and the State of Missouri in making awards of the funds received under the CARES Act. The library was awarded funds for the construction of a pavilion and the purchase of a self-checkout lending library. The pavilion was used for SRP and the Farmers' Market within weeks of completion. The kiosk is housed in Stover at a local coffee shop.
